And I want you to note some things that will happen this Fall, including a Ministry Fair and Breakfast on September 17 th . This will be an opportunity to consider where and how to serve in outreach, grow in faith, and join in fellowship for the coming year. The following week, September 24, will mark the beginning of a new Christian Education class at 8:45a.m.

Later in the season we will host a Rise Against Hunger event; share in fellowship with our neighbors at Brookdale; celebrate our Presbyterian heritage; and welcome our neighbors to Trunk or Treat event at Halloween. The season of Advent (late November thru December 24) will also include a weekly study titled, The Bible and Handel's Messiah, in which we will listen to the music and read the Biblical passages that it shares.

All of these events will take place while we take the final steps to officially become United Presbyterian Church. The Joint Merger Committee continues to work out the details and the plan for uniting Palma Sola and Westminster. Isaiah's prophecy that God is doing a new thing is truly coming to a reality in our work, worship, and connections as a church. I am eager to consider and be part of the opportunities available to us as 2024 begins.

However, in the meantime, let's pause for a time to enjoy summer, for there is much to look forward to doing in the coming months.

• Approved starting a Sunday morning Bible class, beginning on September 24th from 8:45AM to 9:45AM in the church parlor, using 'The Present Word' quarterly curriculum from the PCUSA.

• Approved having an ice cream social after worship on Sunday, July 16th in Fellowship Hall, with a suggested donation of \$5 to go to the Food Bank of Manatee.

• Approved allocating \$4,000 for a Rise Against Hunger Meal Packing Event in Fellowship Hall in early 2024.

• Endorsed plans for a churchwide Beach Picnic on July 26th.

• Concurred with the plan to reduce the number of announcements before worship on Sundays, by having Outreach announcements only on the first and third Sundays of the month.

United Presbyterian Church Joint Merger Committee Update

It may look like not much has happened, but that is not true. Multiple task groups have been working on tasks that need to be completed before the merger occurs.

The Rationale for Merger has been created and is being reviewed before sending it to Peace River Presbytery.

A recommendation on organizing the new Session and Deacons has been provided to each of existing Sessions.

We are currently reviewing our insurance options for our new church.

Task groups are looking into a new outdoor sign and new United Presbyterian Church logos for letter head, other communications, and possible apparel.

A new social media approach is being investigated and designed to make us more visible for neighbors looking for a new Christian home.

Please continue to pray for your new church and the work we are doing to prepare the way.


Mission Spotlight: The Food Bank of Manatee

Food Security is one of our church's focus areas for community outreach and support. The need in our community is great – now more than ever. Our Outreach Offering and DOES It programs in the summer will go to one of our main mission partners in this cause, The Food Bank of Manatee.

With twenty-four schools in Manatee County designated as Community Eligibility Program (CEP) schools, the summer food needs in our community are high. As a CEP school, 100% of students enrolled qualify to receive free breakfast and lunch because the schools are in low-income neighborhoods where food insecurity is prevalent. During the summer months, the school district continues to provide meals to children during the week at the School District of Manatee Summer Break Spots. On Fridays during the summer months, The Food Bank provides additional Food4Families bags at those Break Spots to families in need of vital nutrition. These bags contain breakfast, lunch, and dinner to feed a family of five for two or more days. That is 30 meals – keeping families fed through the weekend.

In the summer of 2023, it is the goal of The Food Bank to provide at least 20,000 meals each week for children and their families. During the nine-week summer break, that is at least 180,000 meals! With the rising costs of food impacting everyone, the cost to provide each meal is approximately \$1, which means The Food Bank needs to raise at least \$180,000 to feed children and families through this summer program.

Please fill the yellow barrels in the Narthex with non-perishable food items and consider making a monetary contribution to help sack summer hunger, making a life-saving impact to Manatee County's most vulnerable.

July & August Outreach Opportunities:

• Our DOES It (Done On Every Sunday) project for June, July, and August will be collecting non-perishable food for The Food Bank of Manatee. The Food Bank is the leading, local source of nutrition for food-insecure babies, children, families, and the elderly in Manatee County. The need in our community is great, especially now that school is out for the summer and fewer children will be receiving food at school. Canned fruits, vegetables, soups, and meats as well as boxed and bagged pasta, rice, beans, and healthy cereal and breakfast bars are always in demand. Drop your items in the yellow barrels in the Narthex or bring them to the church office all summer long!

• In the summer, we also have two BONUS DOES Its to benefit children and education! In July, ;we are collecting school supplies for the Beth-El Farmworker Ministry in Wimauma. Beth-El is a Presbytery sponsored mission whose purpose is to support the farmworking community and their neighbors in need through opportunities for hunger relief, education, healthcare, and spiritual growth. Backpacks full of school supplies will be give to nearly 500 students in grades VPK through college this fall. Please see the list of needed items on page 8. • The Holy Strollers walking group will take a break for the rest of the hot summer but will start up again in the fall. Look for an update on dates and locations in the September Grapevine.


