# Habitat for Humanity Faith Build




For 28 years, local organizations and people have joined together through Manatee Habitat for Humanity to build and renovate homes that offer Manatee County families the opportunity to live life from a position of strength, stability, and self-reliance. Over the years Manatee Habitat has built homes with local Lutheran, Methodist and Presbyterian churches. In March, we were pleased to learn of the dedication of the most recent Faith Build home for the Vasquez family, and we were honored to be a part of supporting its construction.


Preparations are underway for the newest Faith Build localFaith Community in this endeavor. Teresa and her son, Brandon, will be purchasing this home with a 0% interest loan after completing the Home Buyer Program.

Teresa is a referral and care coordinator with a local medical clinic and her son, Brandon, is an ambitious and self-motivated 9th-grader who aspires to become an engineer. Unsatisfied with her current apartment and landlords, Tereasa set out to find a home that would bring her family a sense of stability and belonging. She first reached out to Manatee Habitat in February 2018 after hearing about our program from another Habitat homeowner. Having missed the open application period, she kept reaching out year after year until she finally got an interview. And in February 2022, she was accepted into the program. Teresa and Brandon are both dreaming of everything that having a home will allow them to do. They can't wait to grow their family by adopting a dog which isn't permitted in their current apartment. Teresa is also excited for Brandon to bring his friends over and be proud of the place that they call home. Most of all, she looks forward to not having to worry about the rising rental market and what that will mean for her ability to make ends meet financially.

We are blessed to be able to help provide a forever home for Teresa and Brandon through our financial support. Stay tuned for volunteer workday and other opportunities to be further involved in this worthwhile program in our community.

# June Outreach Update

As we enjoyed the slower pace of May and prepared for a little relaxation during the summer months, there were still many ways you reached out to our community in love and support.

### Recap of recent events:

• You donated **many, many pounds of pet food** for the furry friends of Meals on Wheels clients, helping them care for their loving companions.

• As part of our **PB & J Sandwich Ministry**, you made **400 additional sandwiches** to donate to Our Daily Bread, for a total of **3800** since September.

• You supported local Presbytery Missions with budgeted funds in the amount of \$1700 to Mision Peniel, \$1200 to Cedarkirk Camp & Conference Center, and \$1000 to the Beth-El Farmworker Ministry.

• As part of our Older Adult Ministry, you hosted an **ice cream social with members of Brookdale Palma Sola**, sharing fellowship and fun with our across the street neighbors.

• You supported an immediate need at **Turning Points by purchasing \$250 worth of men's underwear** from budgeted funds.

- You generously gave monetary contributions to Meals on Wheels PLUS.
- Folks volunteered every Friday at Our Daily Bread.

• You provided **toiletries for personal care bags at Turning Points** from previously collected travel-sized items.

### June Outreach Opportunities:

• Our DOES It (Done On Every Sunday) project for June, July, and August will be collecting non-perishable food for The Food Bank of Manatee. The Food Bank is the leading, local source of nutrition for food-insecure babies, children, families, and the elderly in Manatee County. The need in our community is great, especially now that school is out for the summer and fewer children will be receiving food at school. Canned fruits, vegetables, soups, and meats as well as boxed and bagged pasta, rice, beans, and healthy cereal and breakfast bars are always in demand. Drop your items in the yellow barrels in the Narthex or bring them to the church office all summer long!

• Dive Into Reading is looking for volunteers to serve as mentors for their 7th annual summer reading program, created and sponsored by Anna Maria Oyster Bar restaurants. Adult mentors are matched one on one with rising 2nd and 3rd graders from the 15 Manatee County Title I schools, to read with them and help combat the "summer slide" that often happens during summer break in school. This year, Dive Into Reading will welcome over 500 students at various restaurants in Manatee County where they will be served a free breakfast with their mentor, read a book together (which the students get to keep), and go over key words and reading strategies. This year's program runs from June 6th to June 29th, and volunteers are still needed for Wednesdays and Thursdays from 8:30 to 10:30am. • We continue to **collect non-perishable food items in the cart in the Narthex** to donate to **Our Daily Bread**. They are always in need of canned vegetables, fruits, meats, and soups as well as boxes and bags of pasta, rice, cereal and other staples to stock the Loaves & Fishes food pantry.

• Also, please keep in mind our Blessing Box by the east parking lot. **The Blessing Box** serves as a **mini food pantry** for our local neighborhood, and you are welcome to add to it or take from it as needed.

# June Outreach Offering

Our **Outreach Offering for June** will go to **Meals on Wheels PLUS of Manate**e, which provides nutritional assistance and caring, supportive services to homebound seniors in Manatee County. Home delivered meals are delivered by volunteers to over 1000 seniors per day. These meals serve those who are not able to leave their homes and purchase food, or who have limitations that leave them unable to prepare meals. This crucial service allows seniors to continue living independently. Last year Meals on Wheels delivered over 306,000 meals to homebound or disabled seniors in Manatee County.
