

# Choose Peace Instead of Worry Reverend Edward Dunn

The Peace of the Wild Things by Wendell Berry, 2012

When despair for the world grows in me and I wake in the night at the least sound in fear of what my life and my children's lives may be, I go and lie down where the wood drake rests in his beauty on the water, and the great heron feeds.

I come into the peace of wild things who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water.

And I feel above me the day-blind stars waiting with their light. For a time I rest in the grace of the world, and am free.

In Matthew 6:25-34 Jesus addresses the very human condition of worry. He asks "Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?" and "can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?" Instead he advises that we should "strive for the kingdom of God and God's righteousness." Then in what I consider one of those "wink" moments, he adds, "tomorrow will bring about worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today."


I wonder if Jesus' words were the inspiration for Wendell Berry's poem.

It's not entirely surprising that much of what we worry about are things out of our control; at least our direct control. There are numerous events – conflicts abroad, senseless violence in our own community, poverty and hunger and homelessness – that we cannot bring to an end. There are steps we can take to address these issues but we, alone, cannot eradicate them.

Jesus does not grant us a "pass" on conflict, hunger, or violence. While we are encouraged to be prayerful, there are actions we can take. Feeding the hungry at Our Daily Bread, preparing PB&J sandwiches, and supporting the 3 Cents a Meal offering are important ways we can work to alleviate hunger. Communicating with elected officials and decision makers on issues related to violence in our community is another. Praying for those who are entrusted with negotiating peaceful end to war is important too. And, as Berry suggests, taking time to find peace, to set aside our worries and trusting in God who knows our worries and upon whom we can rely.

May you not be overwhelmed by worries out of your control. May you, instead, find work that can be peace giving and living.


## Palma Sola Session Highlights


- Approved Pastor Dunn's absence during the December 25th December 31st period.

#### October Outreach Highlights:

- You assembled 4000 packets of seeds during our fall Hope Seeds packing event. It was a wonderful time of fellowship and fun while helping to fight hunger all over the world.
- You donated many, many bags of warm wear items to help keep those served by Turning Points warm this winter.
- You generously gave monetary contributions to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. November collections will be added to this to make an even bigger impact.
- Folks volunteered every Friday at Our Daily Bread.
- You reached out to families and young people in our neighborhood by hosting a fun-filled Trunk or Treat night for Halloween. Many people enjoyed hot dogs, chili, chips and CANDY as they strolled through our parking lot full of festively decorated cars. A good time was had by all!
- You made an additional 500 PB & J sandwiches that were delivered to clients in need at our Daily Bread for an even 6000 sandwiches since beginning this ministry.
- You continued blessing local organizations through contributions to our 3 Cents a Meal collection.
- You helped spread cheer to farmworkers and their families through the donation of \$600 towards the Mision Peniel Christmas Joy Drive. Over 500 children aged birth to 10 years will receive a new toy for Christmas through your support of this program.
- You sent donations of \$200 each to help offset day-to-day expenses at Our Daily Bread, Salvation Army, Mision Peniel, Beth-El Farmworker Ministry, Cedarkirk Camp & Conference Center, and Christian Care Alliance. These extra gifts go a long way to provide assistance to those served by these wonderful organizations.

#### **November Outreach Opportunities:**

- Our DOES It (Done On Every Sunday) project for November is collecting stuffed shoe boxes to give to clients served by Meals on Wheels PLUS this Christmas.
