This month's Grapevine spans two months – July and August – when activities are somewhat slower at church. Yet that doesn't mean our work is lessened! Please check out the variety of things we will do and the plans we are making for the Fall.

- Did you know that the third Sunday in July has been designated as National Ice Cream Day? So, it is fitting that we have an Ice Cream Social that day following worship! There's more about this event in our Outreach article and an opportunity for you to make a contribution that will aid the Food Bank of Manatee.

- Are you curious about Florida's railroads? Would you like to take a train ride? If so, sign up and join us July 20.

- We're having our annual Beach picnic and walk on Tuesday, July 30. Plan to join us for fellowship and a stroll along the water's edge at Bradenton Beach.
- We hope that "mighty Casey" doesn't strike out when we go to watch the Rays baseball game on August 17. Sign up and pay for your ticket by July 17!

Our preparation for the Fall and the coming year will be focused on a Season of Possibilities. In Ecclesiastes 3 we read, "To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven." We will begin considering our own season of possibilities beginning with our Ministry Fair on September 15. I invite you to join in our time of visioning and considering what the next chapter in our story will be.

In the meantime, I wish you all a continued peaceful and relaxed summer season. Don't forget that we continue to gather for worship each Sunday at 10a.m. and for our summer study, Between Sundays, at 10:30a.m. on Wednesdays.

June Session Highlights

- Approved allocation of \$2,500 to support our participation in the next Faith Build by Habitat for Humanity.
- Designated the rear three pews on the West side of the Sanctuary as a 'fragrance-free zone' to minimize the potential for exposure to perfume allergens. Worshippers in that area are asked to refrain from wearing perfume, body wash or strong after shave lotion to respect those who may be allergic to such aromas.
- Approved a request by Rev. Dunn to be away during the period July 25-30.
- Approved designating a \$5k bequest from the Atherton Family as the Virginia & Paul Atherton Fund for use in underwriting 'Possibilities Projects – to fulfil new and different ministries of this church'.
- Scheduled a Session Workshop for Saturday, September 14th to initiate a Long-Range Study of the future of United Church and linking this work to the 'Season of Possibilities' Theme for this year's Ministry Fair.
- Applauded the completion of work to replace the deteriorated wood framing around all seven windows in Fellowship Hall, as well as the elimination of all tripping hazards due to uneven sidewalk slabs on campus by grinding the slabs at the sidewalk joints.
- Noted that the church is on track to reduce its electric usage by slightly more than 15%, a target set as part of our Earth Care goals for 2024.
- Endorsed a design for new name tags for United Church members and visitors.

From museums to botanical parks to baseball, there are so many fun things to do close to home. July/August Outreach Update

As the lyrics to the song go “There’s a time in each year that we always hold dear, the good old summer time.” Even in this time of rest and relaxation, we still hold dear the ability to reach out to others in Christian love and service. As we enjoy the longer days and try to beat the heat, our church family is still hard at work in the good old summer time.

Recap of June Events and Programs:

- You made home baked cookies for Rich Wachunis to share at the Kairos Prison Ministry Reunion, showing Jesus’ love through your actions.
- You generously donated to The Food Bank of Manatee through our June Outreach Offering. We will add these funds to our July and August collections to provide support for hungry families in our local community.
- Folks volunteered every Friday at Our Daily Bread.
- Proceeds from the Dreyer Trust blessed many families with the gift of assistance, helping with the costs of healthcare, utilities, and rent for a total of \$24,000 in the first 6 months of the year.
- A group of people spent a lovely Saturday at the Salvadore Dali Museum in St. Petersburg sharing fellowship and lunch as part of our Summer Fieldtrip Series.
- You supported an immediate need by purchasing \$100 worth of washcloths from budgeted funds for the shower area at Turning Points.
- As part of our PB & J Sandwich Ministry you made an additional 500 sandwiches for hungry clients at Our Daily Bread.
- You filled the yellow Food Bank barrel TWO TIMES with non-perishable food items, bringing immediate relief to the food insecure this summer.
- You donated much needed school supplies for the Beth-El Farmworker Ministry and Palma Sola Elementary as they prepare for the new school year. \$200 from budgeted funds was used to purchase backpacks for Beth-El and \$300 was sent to Mision Peniel to help with their school supply drive as well.
- You continued blessing others through your generous contributions to our 3 Cents a Meal collection.
- You supported the next Habitat for Humanity Faith Build Home through a donation of \$2,500 from budgeted funds. A matching grant doubled our contribution for a total of \$5,000 toward helping a family of five realize their dream of a forever home.

We recently received word that the 10,000 meals packed at our February Rise Against Hunger event were sent to the Philippines. Meals are being shared at education and health centers in communities in urgent need of nutrition. Thank you to all who helped support this global mission to end hunger!

July/August Outreach Opportunities:

- Our DOES It (Done On Every Sunday) project for July, and August will be collecting non-perishable food for The Food Bank of Manatee. The Food Bank is the leading, local source of nutrition for food-insecure babies, children, families, and the elderly in Manatee County. The need in our community is great, especially now that school is out for the summer and fewer children will be receiving food at school...

... Canned fruits, vegetables, soups, and meats as well as boxed and bagged pasta, rice, beans, and healthy cereal and breakfast bars are always in demand. Drop your items in the yellow barrel in the Narthex or bring them to the church office all summer long!

- We also have a summer bonus DOES It to benefit children and education! In July, we are collecting school supplies for the Beth-El Farmworker Ministry in Wimauma and for our neighborhood school Palma Sola Elementary. Please see the list of needed items and drop your donations in the bins in the Narthex or bring them to the church office by July 28th. Thank you for helping students prepare for a great school year!

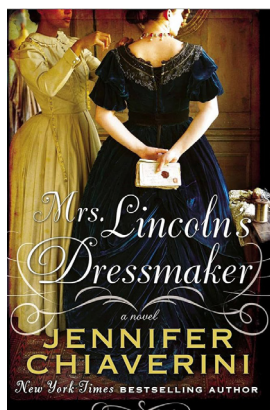
July & August Outreach Offering
