We have the honor to host the meeting of Peace River Presbytery on Saturday, October 19. United Presbyterian Church is one of 36 churches between Palmetto and Naple. Our denomination, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is organized for governance and mission in four levels – the local congregation, presbytery, synod, and General Assembly.

When a presbytery meets, each member church of that presbytery elects Ruling Elder Commissioners to represent it along with every Minister member of the presbytery. When a synod and the General Assembly meet, Elders and Ministers are chosen by each presbytery as their representatives.

We are hosting our presbytery which is both an honor and a reminder that our church is connected to other churches – that we can rely on the presbytery and the presbytery is reliant upon us.

Planning for this day began some time ago and was more clearly understood when we met with the Stated Clerk of Peace River Presbytery. This will be an event in which many hands are needed and where many hands will make for light work. Some assistance will be needed with hospitality and with worship. Some assistance with details such as registration and direction to parts of our building will be needed.

Our church leaders have been working to coordinate some of these details and to "spruce up" our church home because company's coming. We have completed painting projects in the Fellowship Hall and Men's Restroom. A new ceiling has been installed in our kitchen. Work on the exterior is taking place as well including new garden beds alongside the Fellowship Hall's south facing wall.

A number of projects are being completed, not merely because we have guests arriving. They are being completed after years of being deferred, or recognizing the need to clean and refresh and maintain our facility. What we are doing is no different than what we do with our own homes – refreshing and showing pride in the place where we gather for worship and learn and serve.

I am grateful to all who have been working toward this end. I look forward to working alongside the many volunteers who will be present that Saturday to make our friends and siblings in Christ feel welcome.

Thank you for your contributions and your prayers as we prepare for this event.





#### Mission Spotlight: Habitat for Humanity

In honor of its' founding on August 1, 1994, Manatee County Habitat for Humanity is celebrating their 30 th anniversary year. During that time, our church family has been blessed to support the construction of four Habitat Faith Build homes — three of which have been built in the past 5 years.

UPC is proud of our involvement with Habitat, donating over \$10,000 from our budget for the cost of these homes and volunteering time at work days during the building process. We were thrilled to be be be included in the dedication of the most recent Faith Build home for Viviana and her son Daniel on September 12th.



Originally from Columbia and speaking no English, Viviana moved to the U.S. at 21 years old. As a young single mother of two, she worked as a teacher assistant in a daycare for 15 years while pursuing an associate degree in early childhood education. Landing her dream job in 2020 at Step Up Suncoast, she now serves others as a parent educator, helping Spanish-speaking families with child development and other resources. Recently, Viviana was accepted into Manatee Habitat and her efforts – sweat equity plus classes on financial literacy and basic home repair, have led to the opportunity to provide a forever home for her family. As Viviana accepted the keys to her new home, it was heartwarming to see the impact our involvement in this program has had in the lives of others. We look forward to continuing our support of Manatee County Habitat for Humanity in the years to come.
