


- Melana Scruggs, General Presbytery preaching on **Sunday**, **January 4** (while I'm at Duke for my next Immersion Week classes)

## November Session Highlights

- Approved holding a Drive-By Community Food Drive in the East parking lot on Saturday, December 13th to benefit the Food Bank of Manatee County.
- Endorsed scheduling the 'Between the Sundays' Advent Bible Study and luncheon on Wednesdays during Advent so that members might also attend the Advent Services at neighboring Redeemer Lutheran. Redemer has been invited to attend our Bible Study and luncheon, as well.
- Reviewed the many events and services planned for the Holiday Season which will be publicized widely throughout the congregation.
- Reviewed the Preliminary 2026 Operating Budget, which will be finalized in December when results of the Stewardship Campaign are obtained.
- Set February 15th as the date for the Annual Meeting of the congregation.
- Approved hiring a professional appraiser to make an estimate of the value of our church property and buildings.
- Outlined the need for Session to consider reorganizing its structure to permit accomplishing its work with fewer Elders in the future.

## Dec/fan Outreach Update

The advent season and a new year is upon us. Let us know peace and hope as we give through reaching out to our community and beyond.

Thank you for all you do.

#### Let's Recap Some Our Recent Activities:

- We donated \$2400, approximately \$20/member, for food security out of our budget. \$1200 to Our Daily Bread, \$1200 to the food bank.
- We donated \$500, from our budget, to F.E.L.T.
- You donated money through our outreach offering to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.
- You filled Christmas shoeboxes for Meals On Wheels as our D.O.E.S. IT project for November.
- The Dreyer Trust has distributed \$36,466.61 as of October 31st.
- Our first round of Pen Pal letters has been written to the second graders at Palma Sola Elementary School.
- An Angel Tree collection was held for the Salvation Army Christmas Project in November.
- Volunteers faithfully served at Our Daily Bread every Friday.
- Holy Strollers walk every Friday morning at 9 AM from the north entrance to Robinson's Preserve.
- PB&J sandwiches were made for ODB each Sunday after worship.
- The 3 cents a meal collection was held November 30th.

#### **December Does It:**

• Our **DOES It** (**Done On Every Sunday**) project for December is making **12 Days of Christmas food gifts bags to donate to those in need**. Pick up a large fabric reusable grocery bag and place the following items in it, item by item each day as you give thanks to God for your own blessings:

Day 1 – Jar of peanut butter Day 7 – Box of mac 'n' cheese

Day 2 – Jar of jelly
Day 8 – Box of cereal
Day 3 – Box of pasta
Day 9 – 2 lb. bag of rice
Day 4 – Jar of spaghetti sauce
Day 10 – Can of soup

Day 5 – Can of corn Day 11 – Can of chicken or tuna

Day 6 - Can of green beans Day 12 - Roll of toilet tissue & a bar of soap

Return your bags to the Narthex or church office by **December 29th**. Filled bags will be taken to Our Daily Bread for distribution through the Loaves and Fishes food pantry.

## Reigniting Faith - 2026 Faith Build

Our church is honored to support another Habitat for Humanity Faith Build home – our fourth in 5 years! Construction on the latest Faith Build home, and the first home in the new King's Cross Place, will begin in December. We have provided funds toward building costs, and a UPC workday is planned for Saturday, January 31st from 7:45a-noon at the job site. Look for a sign-up sheet in the Narthex and get in on the fun!

Karlee, the 2026 Faith Build homeowner, has walked a powerful road of recovery and redemption; from addition and hardship to hope and healing. Today, she is a devoted mom to her daughter, Kaylea, a mentor to other women in recovery, and a future law student. Karlee is determined to give her daughter the stable home they both deserve.



Habitat for Humanity partners with people in their own community to help build or improve a place for someone to call home. Habitat homeowners help build their own homes alongside volunteers and pay an affordable mortgage. Habitat for Humanity just celebrated its 30th year in Manatee County and has completed 176 homes. They build multiple houses a year at an average cost of \$175,000 not including land, infrastructure, etc. Funding comes from a variety of city and county sources as well as corporate sponsors and community groups. Current building practices incorporate as many green/cost efficient initiatives as possible to help keep the homeowner's expenses down and increase their quality of life.

Potential homeowners go through a rigorous screening process. Their "down payment" includes 500 hours of sweat equity (job site building hours) and classes on home maintenance and finance. Upon completion of the home, the homeowner assumes an interest free 30-year mortgage which averages \$800-\$1000 per month including insurance and property taxes.

UPC is blessed to help provide a forever home for Karlee and Kaylea. For Karlee, home ownership through Manatee County Habitat for Humanity's Faith Build means more than just a roof over their heads. It represents redemption, stability, and the fulfillment of God's promise – a safe place where she and Kaylea can grow, learn, and thrive. Stay tuned for more updates and opportunities to be a part of Kaylee's journey in the new year.


