When we met for our Ministry Fair event on September 14, I was uncertain what to expect. I was anxious about what I might hear from those who would attend. Our topic for this annual event is a difficult one – the future of the church. The discussion we were planning to have focused on this overarching question:

If we were to rebuild this church, what would you envision it looking like?

In answer to this question, two perspectives come to mind; a physical rebuilding and a spiritual rebuilding. We must consider them together, not separately. One calls for more "technical" responses – quick and easy answers; the other calls for "adaptive" responses – longer term, big picture answers. There are few easy answers and many hard answers about our future.

At our meeting that September morning, we heard from leaders who have been engaged in discussions about re-generation. We learned that portions of our building have been shared with groups and businesses in our community including the fire department, Creative Arts Academy, and several smaller businesses. We heard about meetings that have taken place with community leaders asking, "What are the needs of our community?" In reply we have learned that affordable housing is a primary concern and food insecurity and social isolation are secondary issues. Several of you gave voice to ideas about our location and our building in light of the data provided.

The phrase, "To everything there is a season...there is a time to..." is found in Ecclesiastes 3. The result of our prayerful discernment, which includes discussions like the ones we have been and will be engaged in acknowledge a season and a time that is dawning for us.

What is your vision of the church as it goes forward? Where is God leading us? I am encouraged by the openness I have heard from all who have joined in this conversation. I am eager and anxious to hear how God will direct our future and excited that you are joining this journey.

- Understands or is willing to learn the operation and capability of the copier machine.
- Able to analyze a problem situation and offer suggestions on improvements.


Do you know of anyone who might be interested in such a position, three days a week for three hours a day? Perhaps yourself?



October Outreach Update & Opportunities

Welcome back snowbirds, including me. It's nice to get back to the schedule of activities in the church. A "Season of Building and Change", but some things stay the same, like many things in outreach. Check it out! Thank you for all you. The more you give, the more you receive.

September Outreach Activities:



- The Dreyer Trust Disbursements totaled \$27,633.65 to help those in need through the Christian Care Alliance.
- Two barrels of donations of non-perishable food was collected for the Food Bank over the summer.
- Palma Sola Elementary School was delighted with the many donations for their health clinic. See picture.
- Our Outreach Donations for the Food Bank totaled \$780.
- The "3 Cents A Meal" collection for June and August were \$605. (\$201.66 to Beth-El, \$201.67 to Mision Peniel, and \$201.67 to Our Daily Bread).
- F.E.L.T. (Feeding Empty Little Tummies) collection from April to the end of August was \$533.
- A lovely "Thank you" video was received from Mision Peniel for the backpacks purchased for their students.
- Outreach Offering for September has been for Bible Mission USA.
- "Stock Up September" DOES IT project was collecting jelly and zip lock sandwich bags for our PB&J sandwich ministry for Our Daily Bread.
- We have continued to make 100 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches each week. Yay team!!!
- Volunteers have served at Our Daily bread each Friday.

October Outreach Opportunities:

- Our DOES It (Done On Every Sunday) project for October will be collecting toothpaste and toothbrushes for farmworkers and their families served by Mision Peniel in Immokalee. Mision Peniel provides a place to find spiritual renewal, food, clothing, and other personal supplies for the migrant community. Drop your items in the bins in the Narthex or bring them to the church office by October 26th.
- There will be a Fire Safety Presentation given by Manatee Fire Department on Saturday October 4th in fellowship hall from 10-12'.
- Rise Against Hunger Food Packing event will be held on Saturday October 11th from 10:30-12:30 in fellowship hall. This is a fun and rewarding event to help fight world hunger. 90 volunteers are needed to fully staff the event, so bring your family, neighbors and friends.


