February may be a short month, according to the number of days, but those days are active ones at United Presbyterian Church. I'll summarize a few of the events happening over the next 28 days and encourage you to read about them in greater detail within this newsletter.

February 1 will be our **Souper Bowl Sunday**. A suggested \$5 donation gets you a bowl of soup, bread and a cookie. Our donations will go to the Food Bank of Manatee.

February 8 is **Scout Sunday** and we'll recognize our scout groups, Troop and Pack 22, during worship. They will be serving up pancakes during our fellowship time afterward.

Our **Annual Congregational Meeting** will take place on February 15. This will be an opportunity to hear reports about the past year and to engage in the work of the congregation.

The season of Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday, February 18**. Join us for a light lunch beginning at 11:30a.m. followed by a worship service, including the imposition of ashes, at 12:30p.m. Weekly opportunities for learning and a meal will take place each Wednesday during Lent, beginning February 25 through March 25, beginning at 10:30a.m.

United church will host Peace River Presbytery's first meeting of 2026 on Thursday, February 19 beginning at 9a.m. Volunteers are needed to help with greeting Elders and Ministers from other churches in our area, assisting with refreshments and the lunch that will be provided by Westminster Communities.



I invite you to attend our Lenten study series, **“Why Easter Matters”** beginning **Wednesday, February 25 at 10:30a.m.** in the Parlor. These lessons focus on these ideas:

- *When you decide to follow Jesus, it will cost you something. But whatever you've replaced God with is less than God.*
- *When we bargain with God, we are responsible for the outcome. When we surrender, God takes responsibility for the outcome of the journey.*
- *God is not what you have experienced. You can trust God despite your experiences.*
- *The church didn't create the story of Jesus. The resurrection of Jesus launched the church and created our faith.*



Our study time will also include a light lunch meal afterward. This is an occasion to visit or even continue discussions from class. Please consider joining us as your schedule allows.

Dec & Jan Session Highlights

- Session approved the Income/Expense Budget for 2026 with an operating deficit of \$109,179. Details will be available to the congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting.
- Approved a contract to obtain real estate appraisals of the church buildings and the campus property as vacant land.
- Approved the schedule of services for the Advent and Easter season.
- Rescheduled Session meetings to begin at 3:15 pm on the third Tuesday of the month to accommodate its members.
- Approved the 2025 Annual Statistical Report for Presbytery.
- Celebrated the total monetary value of outreach and mission contributions by the membership for 2025 at \$85,434 ! This number does not include the value of in-kind gifts of food, clothing, books, etc. made through other specific collections during the year.
- Approved additional expenditures for audio and visual monitoring, as well as for fire alarm equipment, to ensure that the office building elevator upgrade will meet new State requirements.
- Reviewed procedures for hosting the Stated Presbytery Meeting on February 19th and assigned responsibilities for various duties.

Happy New Year! Let's plan a year showing our love for others through OUTREACH. December and January were full of events celebrating Christmas by giving to others.

Dec 2025 - Jan 2026 Outreach Activities:

- We renewed our membership with S.T.R.E.A.M., Stronger Together Reaching Equality Across Manatee.
- We held a Food Drive on December 13th, collecting non-perishable food goods for Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry.

February Outreach Offering



Dear Pastors, Mission Committees & Donors,






